All participants of the event must be accredited, since no access is granted to the venue without an accreditation badge. Please be advised that you will not receive the badges until your balance with the HOC is cleared to zero.

LUNCH

Lunch for National Junior, Senior, and Paracanoe Teams with accommodation reservations made through the HOC or those who have purchased lunch as part of their accreditation package will be served between 11:00 and 14:30.

From September 1 onwards: Meals will be provided in the Athletes' Catering Area (tent).

Paracanoe Teams: For reasons of accessibility, meals will be served at the University Canteen throughout the period, from August 30 to September 7.

Lunch will be served according to a ticketing system, so please make sure to bring your meal ticket.

DRINKING WATER

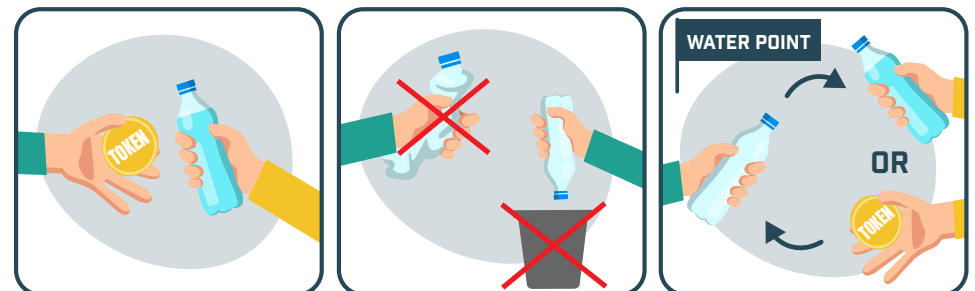
The HOC is pleased to provide bottled drinking water for accredited participants at designated distribution points within the Athletes' Area throughout the designated access period.

1. During the accreditation process, each team will receive two water tokens per team member.
2. At the distribution points, these tokens can be exchanged for the first bottle of water.
3. Additional bottles or tokens will only be issued in exchange for an empty bottle returned at the same location.
4. Our staff is committed to ensuring the proper selective collection of the returned bottles.

5. We kindly request that you return your token at the water distribution points or at the Accreditation Centre before departing.

We would greatly appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that no tokens are taken after the competition.

We urge all team members to actively participate in this initiative, fostering efficient selective waste management. Let's work together to be mindful of our environment!



TO THE ATTENTION OF NATIONAL JUNIOR, SENIOR & PARACANOE TEAMS WITH RESERVATIONS THROUGH THE HOC

The HOC has offered accommodations in two different categories based on the location and quality of the property.

Teams that have chosen the Venue Stay Package will be accommodated in 2-bedroom apartment units located in various buildings of the Széchenyi István University Dormitories, which are situated just next to the venue. If you opted for this accommodation package, please be advised that all three meals will be served at the Athletes' Catering Area at the venue and meal tickets will be provided for each meal for the entire stay.

National Teams with bookings within the City Comfort Package will have breakfast at the hotel, lunch at the venue, and dinner either at the venue (with a meal ticket), at their hotel or at a nearby hotel. We will inform all teams in the Accreditation Centre about the designated location of the dinner.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

TEAM LEADER'S MEETING

The Team Leaders' meeting and the Paracanoe Briefing will take place in person on Wednesday, September 3 at 14:00, in the VIP Room at the University of Győr (a 5-minute walk from the venue).

Only the Team Leader of each nation is eligible to attend the Team Leaders' Meeting.

The final startlist will be published after the team leader's meeting. No printed start lists or results will be issued. All documents will be available online on the official [event website](#).

LATE ENTRY / WITHDRAWAL / CREW CHANGE

In extraordinary circumstances, an application can be submitted to the Chief Official for the acceptance of late event entries and/or withdrawals. It is at the Chief Official's discretion to accept or decline a late

entry/withdrawal. Requests for [late entry](#), withdrawal, or [crew changes](#) can be submitted via the online forms.

DEADLINE TO SUBMIT REQUESTS: September 02, 19:00.

Late event entries/withdrawals will incur a fee of 50 EUR per boat. For already registered athletes, late event entries will also incur a fee of 50 EUR per boat. Late entry fee payments are accepted exclusively by credit card at the competition office. Only requests submitted before the deadline will be taken into consideration. After the deadline, please contact the Chief Official directly.

Any athlete listed in the final entry for their country is eligible to substitute in any other event. Any changes to entries must be communicated

through the online form to the Chief Official at least one hour prior to the first race of the morning or afternoon session. Withdrawal of an entry is final and prohibits the same athlete or crew from participating in any other events of the competition. For crew boats, the competitors' names must be listed in the exact order in which they will race in the boat. The name at the top must correspond to the competitor positioned at the front of the boat.

TEAM'S TENTS

Each nation will have a designated private space in the main event tents. Smaller teams will share this space with other countries. Early-arriving teams must share the area with the Masters competitors until the last day of the Masters events. The tents will remain open; therefore,

please do not leave valuable objects inside during the day or night. The HOC will not be responsible for any items left unsecured. All areas will be equipped with chairs.

BOAT STORAGE AND PARKING

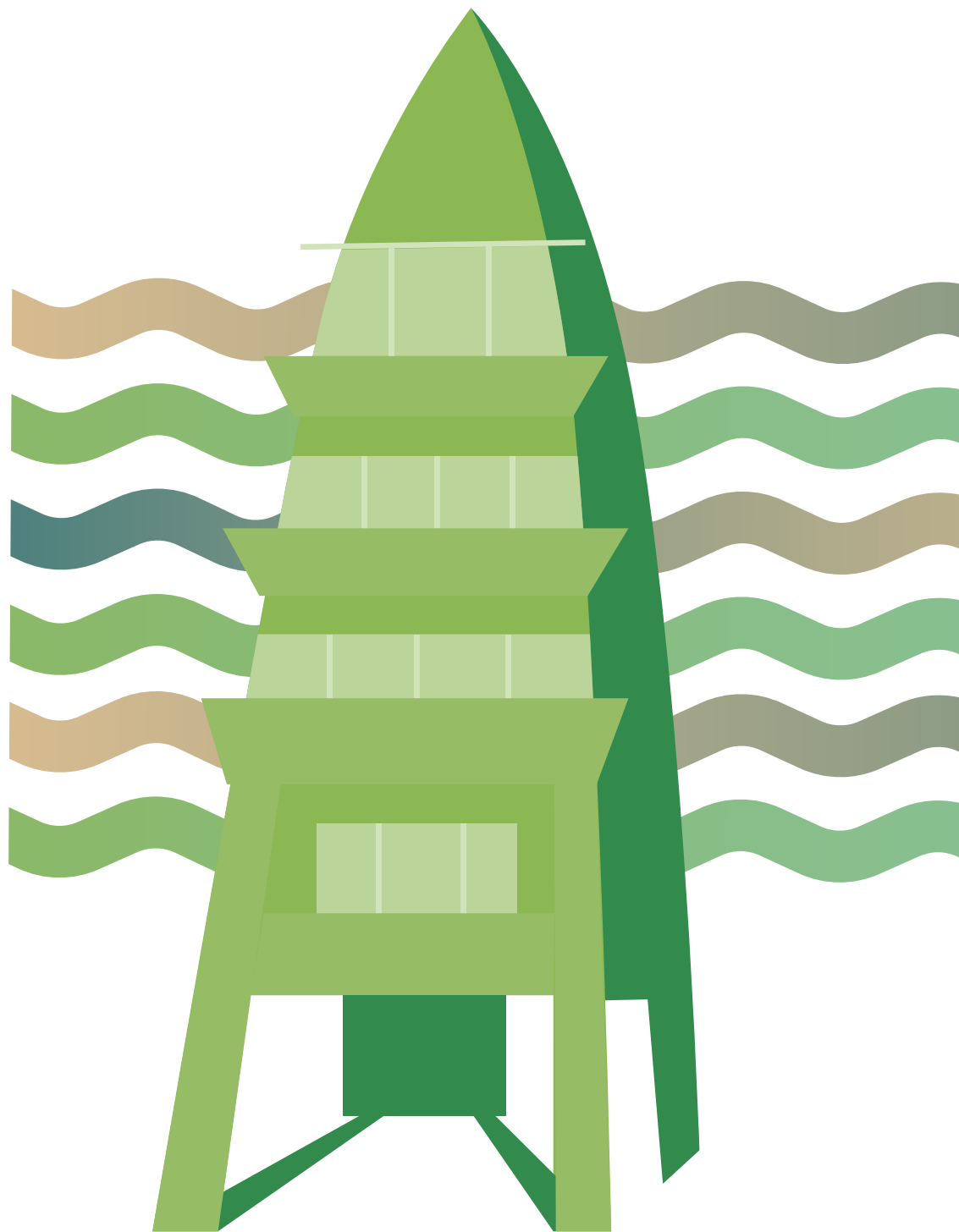
Boat storage will be available at the venue. Dedicated boat racks will be provided for each nation. Early-arriving teams must share the racks with the Masters competitors until the last day of the Masters events. Trailers may also be placed inside the Athletes' Area. Gates will only be open from August 30 to September 8, between 08:00 and 19:00.

All trailers must be parked along the designated boundary and under the supervision of the Organising Committee. Boat trailers may be parked in the area behind the Athletes' Area, but after towing the trailers to the parking lot, vehicles must be removed. Drive-in access to the trailer parking is restricted to boat trailers only. Individually transported boats must be carried manually to the Athletes' Area.

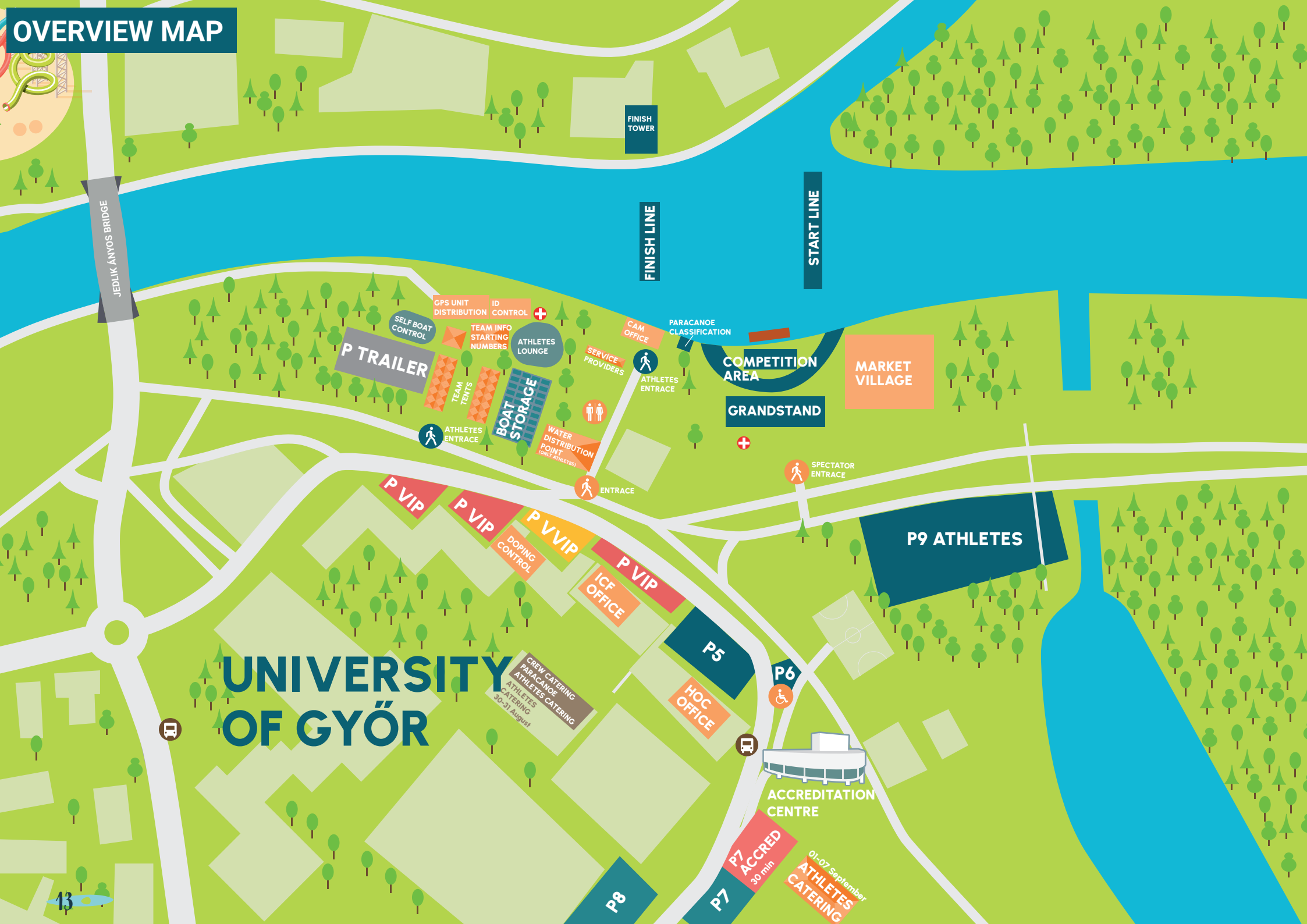
Each team will receive ONE parking sticker. Additional parking stickers may be purchased for 50 EUR per car.

BOAT NUMBER AND TEAM INFORMATION DESK

A Team Info Desk is operated at the event area, where boat numbers can be collected and up-to-date information about the competition can be obtained. Our colleagues will be available during the following opening hours:

Boat numbers may be collected no earlier than one hour before the competition. After each race, all boat numbers must be returned to the raft marshal. All paddlers must ensure that their boats are equipped with suitable number slots containing a hole. Boat numbers must be secured with a pin to the holder.

ATHLETE NAME AND COUNTRY CODE STICKERS

We kindly request that all boats be marked with a sticker bearing the athlete's name for ICF Canoe Marathon competitions. In order for canoes and kayaks to be presented in a standardised manner, name stickers must be placed at the same position on every boat. The country code sticker (provided by the Organising Committee at accreditation) must be applied to all boats in a uniform position for each ICF Canoe Marathon competition, and will be checked at the Identity and Equip-

ment Control. Please use the template provided on the ICF website with the correct sizes and font.

Athletes' name stickers were updated in 2022 to match re-formatted TV graphics. The last name is now placed after the initial of the first name. For the official guideline, please click on the [link](#).



GPS UNIT

All boats must appear at ID Control on Wednesday, September 3, between 08:00 and 16:00, during official training hours, so that organisers can attach Velcro to the boats to ensure proper GPS unit placement.

All boats will be equipped with a GPS device for the duration of the race. GPS devices will be placed on the boats in the ID Control/Raft Marshal area before embarkation.

OFFICIAL TRAINING TIMES

Training will be available on:

September 3, Wednesday	08:00–16:00

Training is only available to accredited athletes. No training is permitted on the regatta course during Masters races, Paracanoë races, or Elite Championships races. Access to training must be made through the same area as ID Control/Raft Marshal.

FINISH AND 2nd BOAT CONTROL

Video finish equipment will be installed and used where applicable.

The finish line will be located between two red buoys in front of the finish tower. After finishing, competitors must vacate the finish zone and course as quickly as possible, without disturbing other racers.

After the finish, all competitors must continue downstream and disembark at the same location where they entered before their race, except

for the first four boats. Boat control will be carried out for the first four boats, plus any others selected by the Competition Committee, at the end of each race. These athletes must disembark at the pontoon in front of the grandstand. During this period, they may also be invited for flash interviews.



SAFETY REGULATIONS ON WATER

The HOC will provide lifeguard service on the water during the official training sessions and on race days, starting one hour before the first race. Please note that the HOC cannot guarantee supervision of the entire water surface; therefore, paddlers must remain within the guarded areas.

Please keep in mind that the HOC does not take responsibility for any accidents occurring outside supervised areas.

START PROCEDURE

The warm-up area for all races in a session is located behind the start pontoon.

All start positions have been assigned by random draw. In all K1 and C1 men's and women's senior races, last year's best paddlers are placed in the middle lanes. The draw positions are numbered from the left, facing in the direction of the course. Boats will line up in numerical order.

ALL BOATS MUST BE ON THE WATER WELL BEFORE THEIR START TIME. THE STARTER WILL NOT WAIT FOR LATE PADDLERS.

The starter will call paddlers to the start line. Please ensure paddlers approach their starting positions promptly so that races may begin on time. Starter commands will be clearly audible to all competitors through loudspeakers along the start pontoon. All commands will be given in English, with the start command being: **READY – GO.**



PORTAGE

The running section of the portage is approximately 85 metres long, with beach disembarkation and embarkation. The feeding area is about 40 metres long. The portage channel will be divided by crowd barriers to define the feeding lane.

Each nation is allowed a maximum of one helper per participating boat to provide food and drink. Helpers must hold a valid accreditation card. A national vest will be issued to each helper, and the accreditation card will be held until the vest is returned to the ITO/NTD in charge.

Helpers are not permitted to enter the non-feeding area. As competitors run at high speed with canoes on their shoulders and limited visibility, it is vital that marshals' instructions are followed. Due to the high number of athletes, officials in charge of the portage area will strictly enforce these rules and will only allow helpers into the feeding area if they are supporting their paddler.

Helpers must not stop suddenly after assisting their paddler, as another boat may be coming behind. They should proceed to the end of the feeding lane and return to the beginning via the third lane provided.

Penalties:

- Penalties incurred during the race will be served in the portage penalty box or added to the competitor's time if they cannot be taken during the race.
- In short-distance and para races, the penalty will be added to the race time.
- A yellow flag will be displayed at the beginning of the portage area when a penalty has been imposed.
- An LED notice board will be located on the left-hand side at the beginning of the portage, showing which boat number has received a penalty and the length of the penalty. It is the paddler's responsibility to check the board.
- Penalised competitors must stop in the penalty box for the designated period. The penalty box will be located at the end of the portage on the right-hand side, with a timing clock indicating the countdown.

COURSE DETAILS

The courses will traverse the Mosoni-Duna, the Rába River, and the city centre of Győr, combining natural landscapes with urban sections. The river current flows at approximately 5 km/h.

The start, finish, and portage areas will all be located in the same vicinity. Competitors will start from a pontoon, with boat-holders assigned to assist each participant. An 85-metre portage will be situated along the riverbank. Both ends of the portage will feature small gravel and grass shores for disembarkation and embarkation, eliminating the need for pontoons. The portage area will be clearly marked with barriers and indicators at the disembarkation and embarkation points.

The HOC will additionally provide virtual animations of the different courses.

Long-distance course

The long-distance course consists of several long laps and one final shorter lap. The race always starts with the long laps and finishes with the shorter lap. The number of long laps (minimum 2, maximum 7) depends on the category. Athletes must pass the portage every lap ex-

cept the first one, but during the first lap they must paddle through the designated passage. This passage is located in front of the grandstand, bordered by floating advertisements on the left side and the pontoon on the right side.

The long lap runs around turning points 1–2–3–4.

The shorter lap runs around turning points 1–2–3–5.

Turning points:

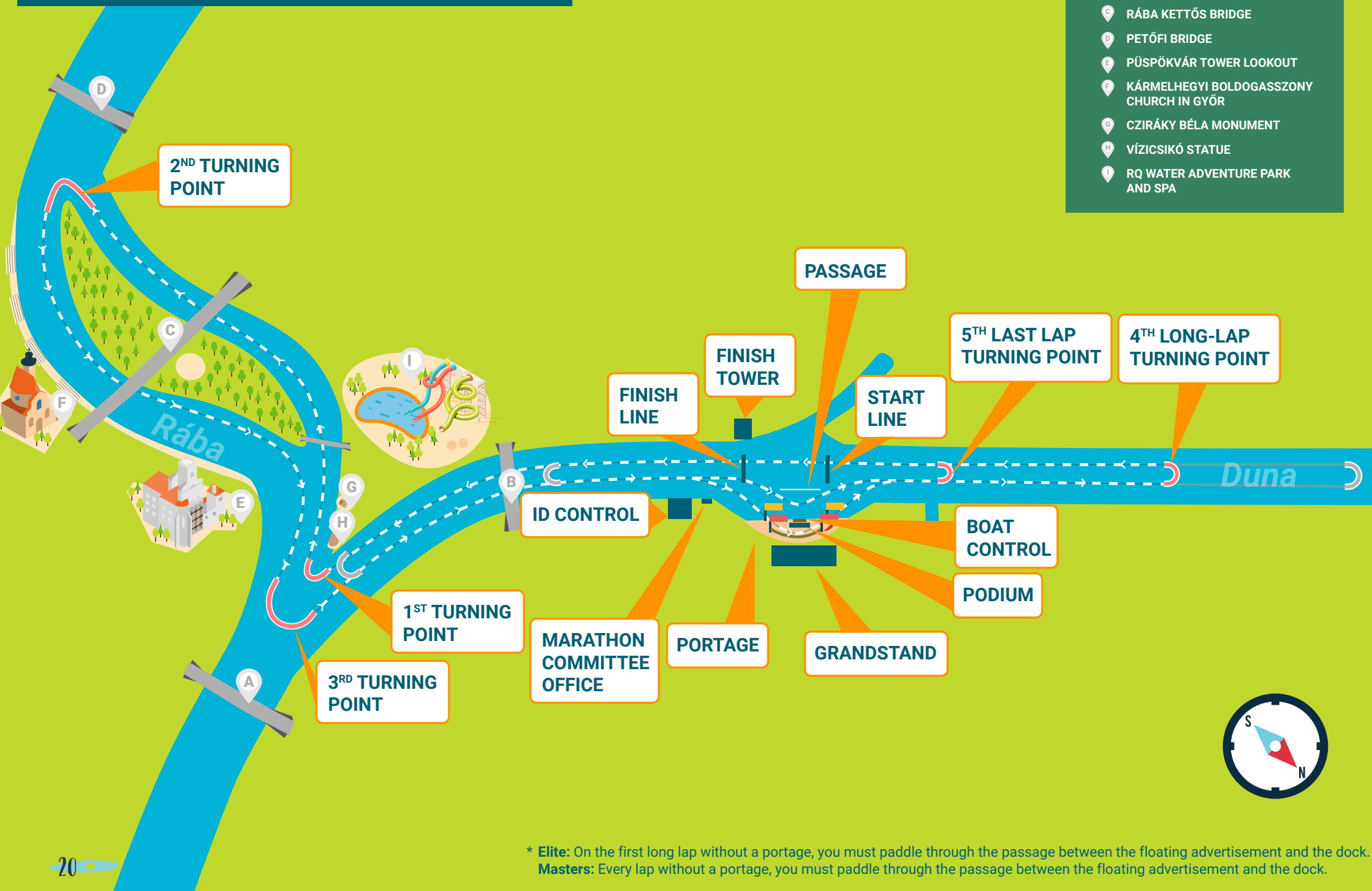
- **TP1:** Confluence of the Rába River and the Danube. Not marked with buoys.
- **TP2:** Top of Radó Island. Not marked with buoys. Beware of shallow water near the island.
- **TP3:** Confluence of the Rába River and the Danube. Marked with buoys.
- **TP4:** Upper turning point of the long lap (between the short-lap and paracanoe turning points). Marked with buoys.
- **TP5:** Short-lap turning point, the closest one above the start line. Marked with buoys.

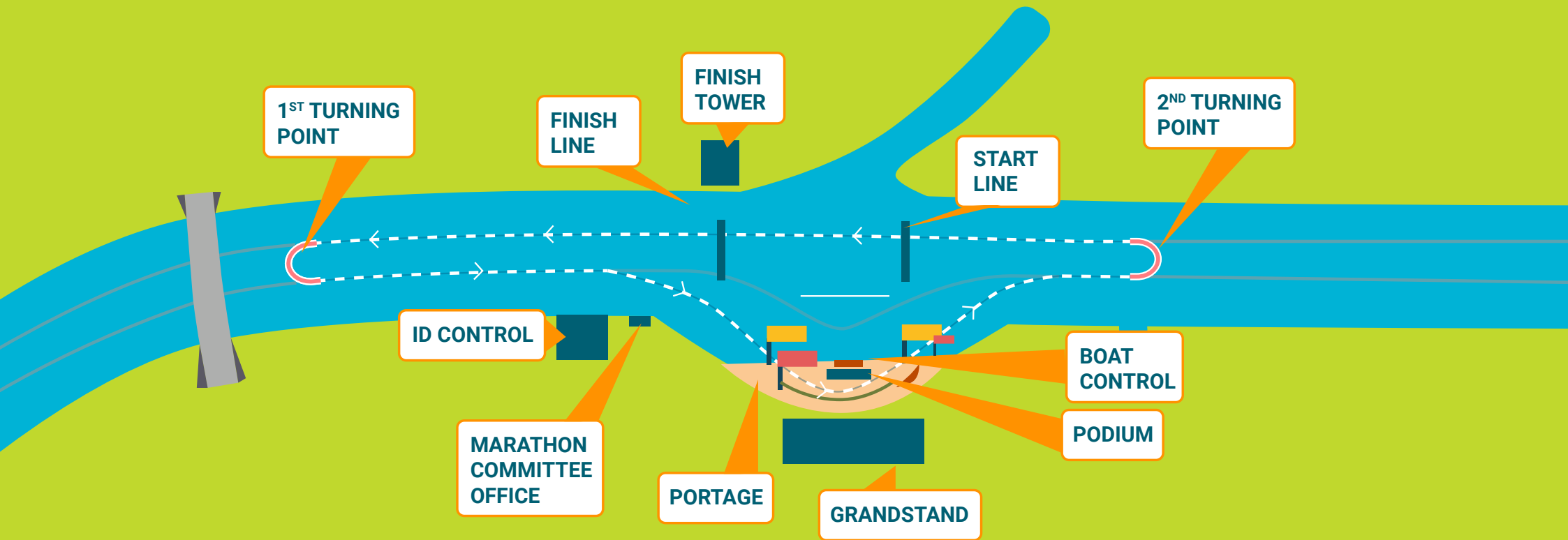
- **TP1:** Under Jedlik Ányos Bridge. Marked with buoys.
- **TP2:** The closest turning point above the start line (same as TP5 in the long-distance course). Marked with buoys.

Paracanoe course

The paracanoe course consists of one or two long laps and one final shorter lap. The race always starts with the long laps and finishes with the shorter lap. The number of long laps depends on the category. Athletes must paddle through the designated passage in every lap. This passage is located in front of the grandstand, bordered by floating advertisements on the left side and the pontoon on the right side.

The long lap runs around turning points 1–2.

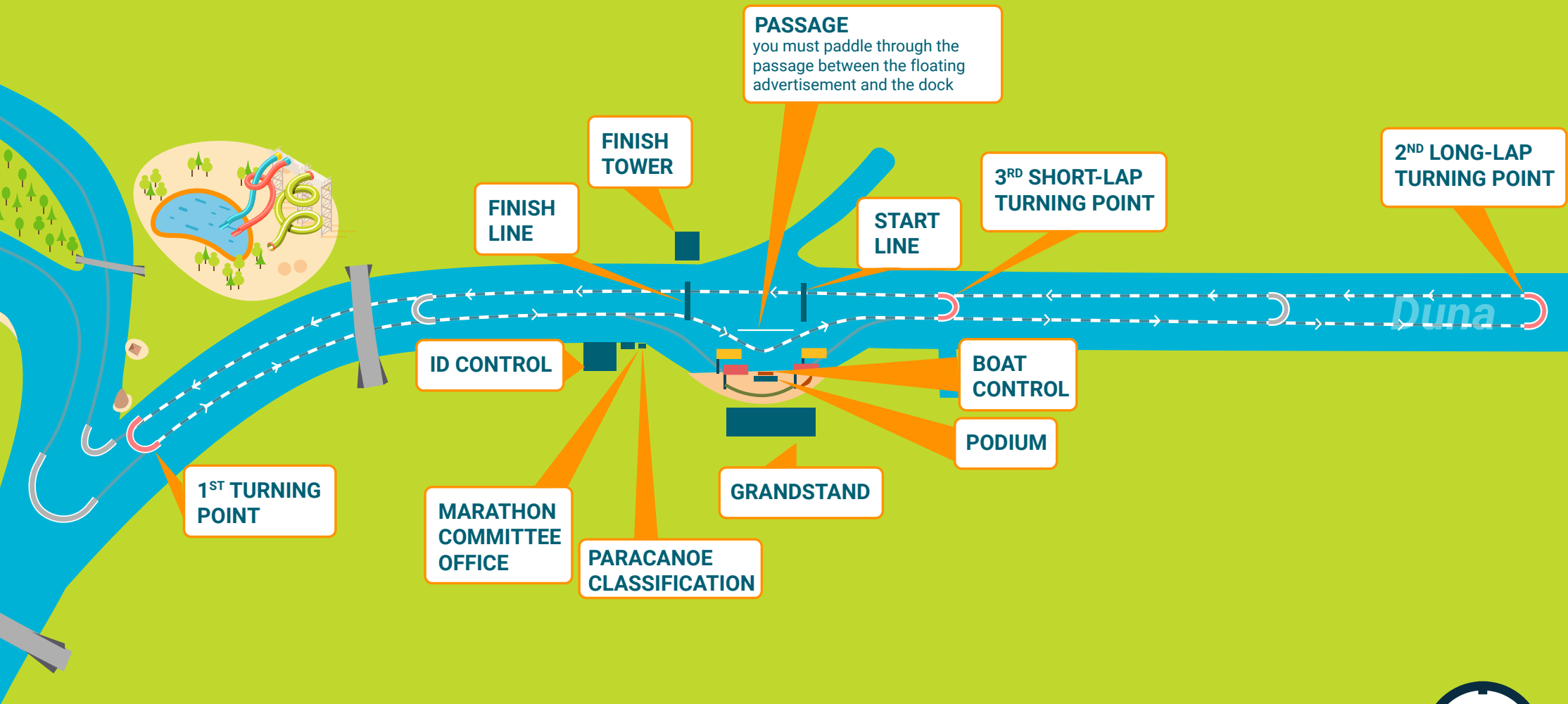
The shorter lap runs around turning points 1–3.

- **TP1:** Before the confluence of the Rába River and the Danube. Marked with buoys.
- **TP2:** The furthest upstream turning point from the event area. Marked with buoys.
- **TP3:** The closest turning point above the start line (same as TP5 in the long-distance course). Marked with buoys.

PARACANOE CLASSIFICATION

Classification of paracanoe athletes will take place at the competition area between September 1-2 (Monday-Tuesday). The dedicated paracanoe pontoon will be installed for the exclusive use of paracanoe ath-

letes during the classification period. For further relevant details please see page 5 of the [Para Canoe Bulletin #1](#) published by the ICF.

RULES

All athletes and team officials are expected to be familiar with the requirements of the [Canoe Marathon Competition Rules](#), available on the ICF website.

The rules also specify the penalties that will be applied if any rules are broken.

ADEL CERTIFICATION

The International Canoe Federation Congress has endorsed a proposal to extend compulsory anti-doping education courses to all senior, U23, and junior international athletes and team staff across all canoeing disciplines. **These courses are mandatory for all international athletes and must be completed before competing in any international event.**

The course provides athletes with information about the dangers of

doping, the importance of anti-doping controls, and promotes positive attitudes towards clean sport. Athletes who have already completed the course do not need to repeat it.

All paddlers competing in this World Championship must hold a valid ALPHA certification.

As the schedule is very tight, we kindly ask you to adhere to this request.

ally, the Team Leader of the winning nation is requested to arrive at the medal ceremony meeting point 10 minutes before the start, to present the flowers during the event.

Please note that caps, sunglasses, and flags are not permitted on the podium.

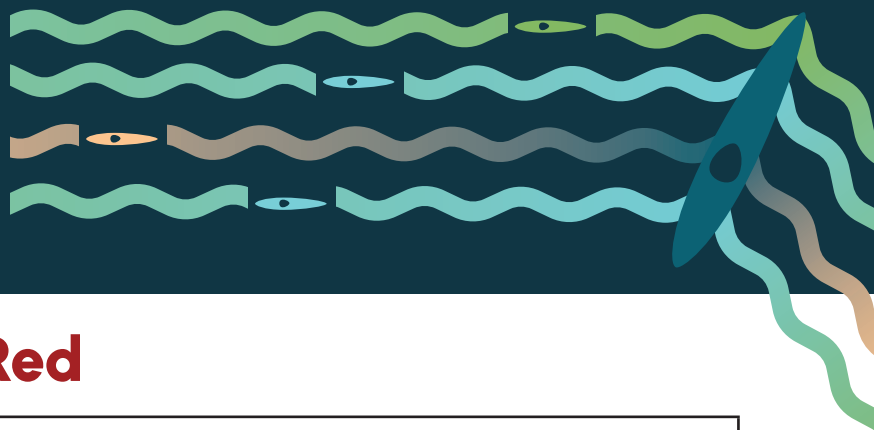
